Visualizing: What helped you visualize the process William went through to construct his windmill? (*the details about how he gathered, bought, or made parts, built the windmill, and wired it to a light bulb; words like “blades rotate faster” helped me visualize the construction process*)



Making Connections: At first, people laughed at William's plans. Have you ever had that experience? How does making that connection help you understand William's experience? (*my cousin had that experience when she announced that she was quitting law school to become a chef, and her family gave her a harder time than William's family gave him*)



Elements of Style: Metaphor



METAPHOR

an imaginative way of describing something as another thing, to suggest that it has the typical qualities of that other thing

"He's not a man, he's a mountain!"

Here's the metaphor. It describes the villain in a way that gives the reader the impression that the man is huge and unbreakable.
